




Now Den Gamle By is a Time Travel Open Air Museum
























The storytelling is focused on real people and real stories

For instance about the pornography exhibited in The second hand shop.




In the Jazzbar it is allowed to smoke.

This certainly also stimulate discussions.




















Basically this part forms the basis for discussions about Danish identity

But basically Den Gamle By is an open-air museum conceptualized as a time travel. In 2010/11 a new task was given to Den Gamle By: The history of Aarhus

A little background:

Den Gamle By is "born" in Aarhus in 1914 and in the first decades large parts of the museum's houses and collections related to Aarhus.

From the 1920s Den Gamle By was in reality both a local museum for Aarhus and the national open-air museum of urban history and culture.

In 1993 the City Council decided to establish a special museum dedicated to Aarhus' history.

As a consequence Den Gamle By now focused on being a national museum.

In 2011 The City Council decided to close down the Aarhus museum and asked Den Gamle By to take over.

Luckily we also got the staff and the budget for the running costs.

We recognized that Aarhus has had museums for more than 150 years. But never an exhibition telling the history of the city.

So we knew what to do.

And we had to find out how to do it and how to combine the local and the national angles. We know that the visitor's experience at Den Gamle By is a good day out in combination with content and substance.

We wanted the same for the new Aarhus Story exhibition

We also know that many people are fond of Den Gamle By's combination of intelligible exhibitions and the possibility of digging deeper into the matter.

We wanted the same for the new Aarhus Story exhibition We also know that Den Gamle By always has been a national museum with a lot of stories from Aarhus.

We decided to make a virtue out of that and integrate the local and the national perspective into the upcoming exhibition about Aarhus.

Den Gamle By is a time travel from pre-industrial times until to-day.

We wanted the Aarhus Story exhibition to be a chronological survey of Aarhus' history from the city's founding in the Viking period until to-day.

We developed the concept, we made it fit with the museum's other development projects, and we were lucky with the fundraisning.









































Until now the Aarhus Story Experience has been visited by more than 150.000 visitors.

The response has been overwhelmingly positive.

And we have learned a lot.

I will sum up the main principles.

The Aarhus Story is meant to be a *chronological* time travel in Aarhus' history from the founding of the city until to-day.

As it is the case with Den Gamle By the Aarhus Story is meant to be a fruitful combination of a good day out and some substance and content.

As with Den Gamle By the Aarhus Story is a combination of local and national history. So you can consider Aarhus Story as the history of a typical Danish Town - and the example is Aarhus. And of course also the other way round.

The Aarhus Story is meant to be a combination of easy understandable exhibitions and the possibility of digging deeper into the matter.

The Aarhus Story is designed as a combination of *immersive* experiences and areas with more detailed information.

Capsule 6 In Aarhus Story we focus on people and their stories more than on things and objects.

As with Den Gamle By in general the Aarhus Story create shared experiences and try to avoid introvert and individualized storytelling.

The Aarhus Story is a permanent exhibition and experience.

At Den Gamle By we believe that museums are important.

It is therefore our aim to reach out to as many people as possible. Even to people who believe that museums are boring and elitist.

To us the starting point shall always be the visitors. Of course, we recognize that museums also are about research, collections and preservation, but the focus must be on the visitors.

How do we hook them, how do we catch their fascination, how do we trigger their imagination, how do we touch their hearts - so that they will be open to the insight and experience that is the basic purpose of our museums.

This is basically what this conference is about.
